

NOTICE FOR THOSE PLAYING MAGICAL KENYA OPEN and SDC
CHAMPIONSHIPS/ JOHNSON WORKWEAR OPEN (SOUTH AFRICA)

Yellow Fever certificate

For those playing **BOTH** the Magical Kenya Open, and the South African events immediately after, the DP Tour recommends bring your yellow fever certificate, or if you have not been immunised against Yellow Fever, to get this before you travel.

The Kenya Open is not played in a part of Kenya where Yellow Fever vaccination is advised (as per UK, US, and more general

But South Africa specifies proof of Yellow Fever certificate for those travelling from a country where yellow fever can be contracted, which includes Kenya.

In summary:

- if only playing Kenya OR South Africa, yellow fever certificate/ vaccine is not a requirement.
- Most players based on their previous travel will have received yellow fever vaccination.
- If playing **BOTH** Kenya and South Africa, please bring yellow fever certificate or get vaccination.
- Most cities have a travel clinic where you can receive a yellow fever vaccine, and further travel advice.

Covid-19 Notice

All travellers to Kenya are required to show the following for entry:

- If vaccinated, proof of a Covid-19 vaccine certificate.
- If not vaccinated, a negative Covid-19 PCR test conducted no more than 72hrs before departure.
